Our Development team has been working hard to support the agency's mission through a variety of fundraising and marketing efforts, including:

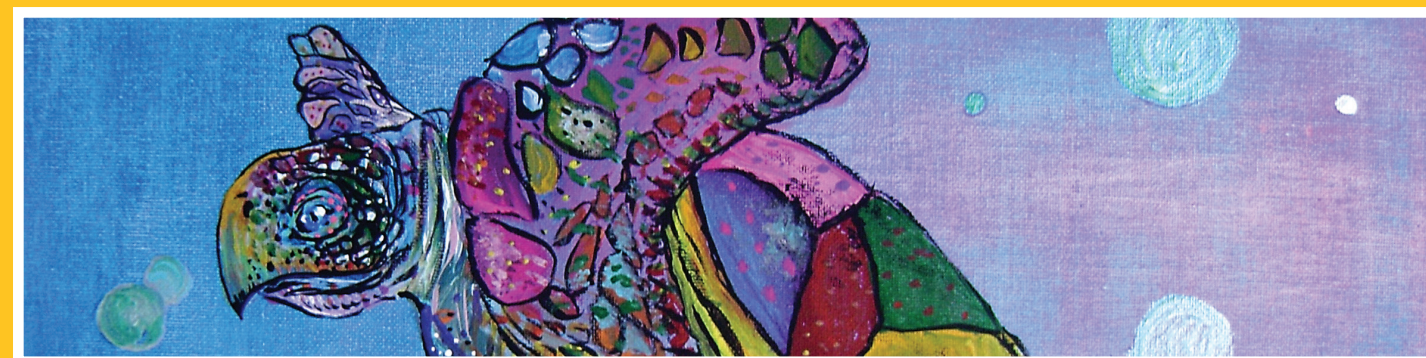
- ★ **Coastline Community Capacity Campaign:** This project is underway, and the building is projected to open in late May. This facility will provide a safe place for individuals to receive services.

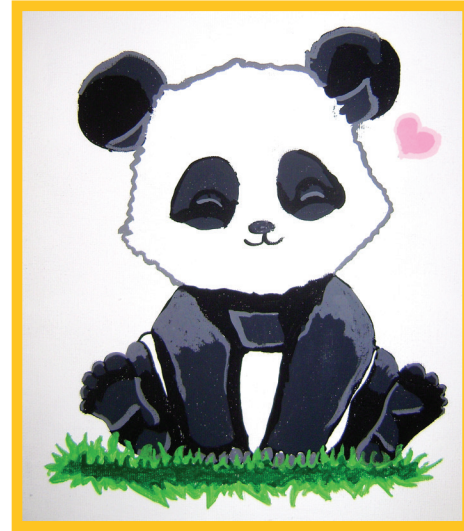
